AGENDA ITEM NO. 9 – REVIEW BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS. Randy Woldt, City Administrator/Utility Superintendent, stated he has no building permit applications at this time.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 10 – COMMUNICATIONS, REPORTS, COMMENTS BY COUNCIL, CITY OFFICIALS AND GENERAL PUBLIC.

A. Randy Woldt, City Administrator/Utility Superintendent stated that the City of Wisner received in the mail today a dividend check in the amount of \$12,371.66 from EMC Insurance Company. Mr. Woldt stated that last week they received bids for the Grandview for sewer, water, and paving. Penro is the lowest bid and will be on the next meeting agenda for approval. Mayor Dixon asked about the painting of the water tower and Mr. Woldt stated that he has not been able to get ahold of the contractor.

B. Councilman Jay asked if the trails contractors are done seeding. Mr. Woldt said that he doesn't think they are done yet. They wanted to wait to see what came up and may add more seed to the ground. Councilman Jay asked if the bikes are supposed to ride down the street where the painting states. Mr. Woldt stated that is where they are supposed to go and that is what he was told today. The light poles for the trails are out probably close to another sixty days yet.

C. Councilman Soden also received a phone call regarding the seeding of grass along the park road. Mr. Soden stated they may have to wait to see what comes up first. Mr. Soden also asked with the pipe up at the Grandview Addition, if that is for the mains. Mr. Woldt stated it is for the sewer and water mains for the Grandview Addition and not for the water tower. Councilman Barry asked about purchasing one or two lots for a turnaround for the water treatment facility. Mr. Woldt said that he talked to the Cuming County Economic Development Director and he is aware about needing a lot. Mr. Woldt said he is still waiting to hear from the engineer on how the building will lay out.

D. Councilwoman Gobar stated that she noticed that they planted new scrubs and trees at the Crown Project and was wondering if they have done anything to control the water runoff. Mayor Dixon said that Mr. Woldt has been in contact with them and has not done anything to fix the problem. The fine is minimal, but may need to start enforcing the fine.

E. Mayor Dixon had the students at tonight's meeting introduce themselves and welcomed them to the meeting.

F. The Wisner News Chronicle editor had some questions regarding the water issue in town.
