The City Council of the City of Wisner, Nebraska met in regular session in the Council Chambers at the City Offices in Wisner, Nebraska, on Tuesday, July 5, 2022, at 7:00 P.M. according to the notice published in the Wisner News Chronicle issue of June 30, 2022, a copy of the proof of publication is attached to these minutes. Notice of the meeting was posted in three public places which are the Wisner Post Office, Wisner Public Library, and the Wisner City Office. Notice of the meeting and the agenda were mailed or emailed to the mayor and all members of the City Council. A true copy of their signed acknowledgement of the receipt of the advance notice of this meeting and the agenda is filed in the office of the City Clerk/Treasurer. An agenda for the meeting was kept continuously current and was available for public inspection at the City Offices three days before the meeting date. Agenda subjects were contained at least twenty-four hours prior to the meeting. The mayor presided and the City Clerk/Treasurer recorded the proceedings of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the general public.

Mayor Dixon called the meeting to order and announced the location of the posted Open Meetings Act, pursuant to Section 84-1412(8) of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act. Mayor Dixon also announced that this meeting is being recorded.

Present on the roll call: Cathy Gobar, Terry Soden, Barry Meyer, Jay Meyer, and Mayor Chad Dixon. Staff present: Randy Woldt, City Administrator/Utility Superintendent, Stephanie James, City Clerk/Treasurer, Jonathan Brandow, Wisner Care Center Administrator, and Officer McLean, Wisner Police Department.

AGENDA ITEM NO 1 – CONSENT AGENDA – AGENDA, MINUTES OF THE JUNE 20, 2022 REGULAR MEETING, CARE CENTER, CITY, AND CITY/RURAL FIRE BOARD ACCOUNTS PAYABLES FOR JULY 2022, SPECIAL DESIGNATED LICENSE – BRU'S PACKAGE & LOUNGE – 07/23/2022 – BEER GARDEN – 10:00 AM TO 2:00 AM – 1002 AVE E. Moved by Barry and seconded by Gobar to approve the consent agenda as presented. Roll call: Ayes: Barry, Soden, Jay, Gobar. Nay: None. Absent: None. Motion carried. Care Center payable total - \$185,663.48, and net payroll total for June - \$147,078.19, City payable total - \$376,552.28 and net payroll total for June - \$67,072.34, and City/Rural Fire Board payable total - \$3,404.00, be approved and allowed; and those warrants be drawn for their payment; and the City Clerk/ Treasurer publish said claims according to law; and an itemized account be kept on file in the office of the Wisner Care Center and Wisner City Office for public inspection. A copy of the signed acknowledgement of receipt and approval of each is attached to these minutes.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 2 – TRAILS PROJECT – PRESENTATION OF GRANT FUNDS – DENNIS SCHULTZ, LOWER ELKHORN NRD BOARD MEMBER. Dennis Schultz took this time to congratulate the mayor and city council on the Wisner Parks Improvement Project. The Lower

Elkhorn NRD is happy to support such projects and we should be proud of our accomplishments. Mr. Dennis went on to say, on behalf of the board and staff, we are happy to cooperate with the City of Wisner and the Recreational Area Project Development and is happy to present a check to the City of Wisner in the amount of \$30,000.00. Mr. Schultz said we should be proud of the project for Wisner residents to use in the years to come. Mayor Dixon stated that he has received a lot of comments on the trails and thanks the Lower Elkhorn NRD acceptance of our grant request and appreciates the funds that are going towards this project.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 3 – WATER TOWER PROJECT – CHANGE ORDER FOR 50% MATERIAL COST INCREASE. Mayor Dixon stated that we have finally received the paperwork for the change order in material cost increase. The city protested the amount and finally agreed on an amount. The original amount was around \$35,000.00. After a few months of meetings with the city attorney, the engineer, and Gerard Tank, they agreed to split the cost which the city's half came to \$27,626.72. Moved by Barry and seconded by Soden to approve the change order for 50% of the material cost increase in the amount of \$27,626.72 on the water tower project. Roll call: Ayes: Soden, Barry, Gobar. Nay: Jay. Absent: None. Motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 4 – UTILITY BILLING – REPORT ON RECEIVABLES. Stephanie James, City Clerk/Treasurer, stated that as of tonight's meeting we are at \$7,743.50.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 5 – REVIEW BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS. Randy Woldt, City Administrator/Utility Superintendent, stated he has no building permit applications at this time.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 6 – COMMUNICATIONS, REPORTS, COMMENTS BY COUNCIL, CITY OFFICIALS AND GENERAL PUBLIC.

A. Mr. Woldt stated that there are a couple of sheets provided to the council of the annual inspection on the boom trucks. There were some major problems with them that will cost between \$35,000.00 to \$40,000.00 to fix both of them. Mayor Dixon asked what the years are on each of the rigs. Mr. Woldt said that the elbow boom is a 2003 and the digger derrick is a 2007. Mr. Woldt asked about borrowing one of Schmader Electric's trucks and he was not really in favor of that. Councilman Barry thought maybe one of the electricians in town would let us borrow theirs if we need one while ours are getting fixed. Mr. Woldt stated that each one will be down about a week for repairs. Councilman Soden asked if parts would be available. Mr. Woldt said it sounded like parts are available. Councilwoman Gobar asked if the boom truck would be needed to put up the scoreboard. Mr. Woldt said that the boom truck would be needed. Councilwoman ask if Mr. Woldt has heard anything about the beams. Mr. Woldt stated that the beams were ordered through Country Welding, Country Welding called back the next day and said that Nucor would not be making them until the 20th of this month and expect delivery two weeks later. That was not acceptable. Jason Schweers went and talked to some people at Nucor and found some beams at their plant in Kansas City and should be in Norfolk right now being cut down to the size needed. Mr. Schweers is in the process of doing some more fundraising to cover the beams. Councilman Soden asked if the inspector red flagged the trucks that we cannot use them at all. Mr. Woldt said that they are listed

as category one which means they are unsafe remove from service. Mr. Woldt said that he was contacted by the engineers that there is some funding regarding the water treatment facility. If we went to a RO System, there is a four million dollar pot out there for six communities could draw out of. Mr. Woldt said let's try and see what happens. At the end it may not be worth going that direction and we can withdrawal our application. Councilman Barry asked if we could still get the forty-five percent forgiveness still an option. Mr. Woldt said that would be part of the funding. Mr. Woldt then stated that we failed our last quarter test on nitrates. The nitrate level this time was at a 11.1. It went up one from last quarter. We still have to advertise and supply bottled water. Mr. Woldt said that the engineers were out to look regarding the easement with Mrs. So. The engineers are working on this now and hope to have some answers soon on a possible new location.

- B. Councilwoman Gobar gave an update on the pool. There was a little issue that some of the lifeguards didn't have an updated CPR certification. A lot of the kids took the class online and is not accepted. Everything has been resolved by tonight's meeting. Mayor Dixon said that attendance has been great.
- C. Councilman Barry asked about the light poles for the trails project. Mr. Woldt has not heard a recent update on the delivery of the poles. It should be getting close for them to be here.
- D. Stephanie James reported on the information from LARM. It is getting close to the city's renewal on insurance and that there will be a resolution on the next agenda to approve which discounted amount they would like. Mrs. James was just providing the council with what option they chose last year so that they could decide what they would like to do this year. If the council went with the same option as last year which was a four percent discount, it would go from \$97,431.00 to \$93,534.00.
