AGENDA ITEM NO. 4 – UTILITY BILLING – REPORT ON RECEIVABLES. Stephanie James, City Clerk/Treasurer, stated that as of tonight's meeting, the past due amount is at \$2,412.07.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 5 – REVIEW BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS. Randy Woldt, City Administrator/Utility Superintendent, stated he has no building permit at this time.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 6 – COMMUNICATIONS, REPORTS, COMMENTS BY COUNCIL, CITY OFFICIALS AND GENERAL PUBLIC.

- A. Councilman Parker stated that the pool ad for lifeguards is out and hope we get some applications in. Mrs. James stated that there are three or four turned in already. Councilman Parker would like to start hiring in early March.
- B. Mr. Woldt stated that Southwest Power Pool sent out a letter stating that Zone 17 will be having a rate increase on their transmission which covers most of Nebraska. Nebraska Public Power and Cuming County Power will more than likely be passing those costs onto the city. The letter stated that the increase will be about 11% to 14% increase. Mr. Woldt stated that there will be a Teams meeting tomorrow with NDOT regarding the Four-Lane Highway from Wisner to West Point with discussion on the city's lift station. The engineers estimate to move the lift station is right around \$1.3 million. This expense should be a reimbursable expense for the city. The new location will still be in the state's right of way.
- C. Councilman Schweers asked if there is a reason that the council meetings are held at 7:00 PM instead of like six or right after work. Mrs. James stated that this how it was set many years ago by ordinance, which can be changed. Other thoughts and

times were discussed what would work and scheduling for planning commission meetings. Councilwoman Gobar asked about the post on Facebook about trees. Councilwoman Gobar asked what kind of trees there were and where they have to be planted. Mr. Woldt stated that they have to be planted in the city's right of way and the trees that are available are Burr Oak, American Lindon, Prinston Elm, and Autumn Blaze Maple. Nielsen Tree Farms will plant the trees for the city if the grant is approved. The city will be taking down a few more trees in town.

D. Dusty with the newspaper stated that the newspaper office is now closed and has been sold. For now, there will be no office in Wisner. The paper was also bought out by another company but have been told that business will run the same as it has been.
