The City Council of the City of Wisner, Nebraska met in regular session in the Council Chambers at the City Offices in Wisner, Nebraska, on Monday, March 3, 2025, at 7:00 P.M. according to the notice published in the Wisner News Chronicle issue of February 27, 2025, a copy of the proof of publication is attached to these minutes. Notice of the meeting was posted in three public places which are the Wisner Post Office, Wisner Public Library, and the Wisner City Office. Notice of the meeting and the agenda were mailed or emailed to the mayor and all members of the City Council. A true copy of their signed acknowledgement of the receipt of the advance notice of this meeting and the agenda is filed in the office of the City Clerk/Treasurer. An agenda for the meeting was kept continuously current and was available for public inspection at the City Offices three days before the meeting date. AGENDA ITEM NO. 2 – ORDINANCE NO. 2025-1190 – REVISING MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 1-306, PROVIDING FOR THE HOUR, DAY, AND TIME AT WHICH REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS SHALL BE HELD. Councilman Schweers introduced Ordinance No. 2025-1190, entitled: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WISNER, NEBRASKA, REVISING MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 1-306, PROVIDING FOR THE HOUR, DAY, AND TIME AT WHICH REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE CITY COUNCIL SHALL BE HELD; REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND SECTIONS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE, moved by Councilman Meyer that the statutory rule requiring readings on three different days be suspended. Stephanie James, City Clerk/Treasurer stated that this will not go into effect until the first meeting in April.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 3 – POLICE DEPARTMENT – DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING HIRING OF GRANT OFFICER. Chief Salman stated that they started the hiring process and ended up with four applicants. There were two certified and two non-certified. Background checks were completed on the two certified applicants. After reviewing all the applications, Chief Salmen and Mayor Soden conducted an interview with one of the applicants, Cody Lanagan. Cody lives in Norfolk and is currently working in security. Mr. Lanagan was an officer for Madison, Stanton County, and Norfolk. Chief Salmen recommends the hiring of Cody Lanagan with a starting salary of \$62,400. Moved by Meyer and seconded by Parker approve the recommendation of Chief Salmen to hire Cody Lanagan for the third officer position with a starting salary of \$62,400. AGENDA ITEM NO. 5 – REVIEW BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS. Randy Woldt, City Administrator/Utility Superintendent, stated he has one building permit at this time. It is at 517 14 St. to put up a portable greenhouse.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 6 – COMMUNICATIONS, REPORTS, COMMENTS BY COUNCIL, CITY OFFICIALS AND GENERAL PUBLIC.

A. Councilman Parker would like to get the pool committee together before the next council meeting to go over the pool applicants and get them on the next agenda for

hire. Councilwoman Gobar and Councilman Parker will get together to go over the applications that have been submitted.

- B. Councilman Schweers asked if this hiring for the third officer locks him into a contract. Chief Salmen stated that legally there is no labor contracts for law enforcement officers. The city will get reimbursed for part of his salaries for three years and then the city has to keep him hired for another year after the grant is complete. Chief Salmen was very tickled to have the applications that were received. Mr. Lanagan will reside in Norfolk until he knows what school his daughter will attend. He will be on probation for six months and will have to sign off on all of the policies and ordinances that he has read them. Chief Salmen will not put him on the streets until he has a city issued vest. Chief Salmen is shooting for March 11th for a start date.
